## WINTERIZING THE FARM

## Garden

IJ	Summer crops narvested and stored/processed.
[]	Fall crops are sown.
[]	Spent plants pulled and added to compost.
[]	Trellises removed and stored away.
[]	Hoses, irrigation equipment, and all watering apparatuses removed, drained, and stored.
[]	Fall amendments added and worked into the soil by method of choice.
[]	Garden soil covered and protected by mulching or cover crop.
[]	Cold-frames & mini hoop-houses brought out of storage to cover winter-hardy crops.
	Homestead
[]	Close up summer entrances – bulkhead, etc.
[]	Re-install storm windows.
[]	Check heat source—have it serviced.
[]	Stop drafts—weather-strip & caulk around exterior doors & windows, openings for pipes, wires, vents &
du	cts.
[]	Clean heat registers, vents & duct-openings.
[]	Inspect chimney/flue—clean it.
[]	Shut off outdoor spigots.
[]	Pick up the yard—toys, bar-b-que, etc.
[]	Protect exposed pipes by insulating or wrapping with heat tape.
[]	Prepare winter-survival equipment; gather in one place, bin or bag, etc.
	Apiary
[]	Mite tests performed & miticides applied if necessary.
[]	Brood nest is properly positioned in the bottom box.
[]	Colonies each have adequate pollen & honey stores for the winter.
[]	Extra summer equipment removed: honey supers, queen excluders, pollen-traps, etc.
[]	Entrance reducers in place.
[]	Mouse-checks and guards installed.
[]	Moisture absorption material applied above the inner cover.
[]	Candy-board or dry sugar applied if desired.
[]	Wrap hives according to local practices.
[]	Wind-break provided for hives.
[]	Top covers weighted down.
f 1	Fauinment stored—combs protected from winter-mice

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## Livestock

[ ] Annual fall health examinations: trim hooves, fall shearing, administer vaccines/wormers, etc.
[ ] Stop drafts in barns/livestock sheds.
[ ] Maintain adequate ventilation in barns/sheds.
[ ] Thorough fall cleanings of livestock housing.
[ ] Make necessary repairs to barns and/or livestock sheds.
[ ] Stock up on feed and bedding for all livestock.
[ ] Service heaters & well-pumps.
[ ] Air livestock blankets & examine to see if repair/replacements are needed.
[ ] Stock-up barn's first-aid kit.
[ ] Consider how to provide water to livestock all winter & prepare necessary equipment.
[ ] Ensure heated-waterers are working properly.
Equipment
[ ] Put antifreeze in tractor.
[ ] Make sure the farm truck is equipped for winter: antifreeze, good tires, proper maintenance, etc.
[ ] Pick up and put away any tools that are still out.
[ ] Store mowers or other such equipment, making sure they are cleaned of dirt and debris.
[ ] Clean all tools before storing.
Homestead
[ ] Close up summer entrances – bulkhead, etc.
[ ] Re-install storm windows.
[ ] Check heat source—have it serviced.
[ ] Stop drafts—weather-strip & caulk around exterior doors & windows, openings for pipes, wires, vents &
ducts.
[ ] Clean heat registers, vents & duct-openings.

Winter Survival Equipment
[ ] Flashlight(s)

[ ] Emergency heat-source
[ ] Blankets and/or sleeping bags
[ ] Emergency cook-source (ie - camp-stove, etc.)
